Journey – “Adult Confirmation”

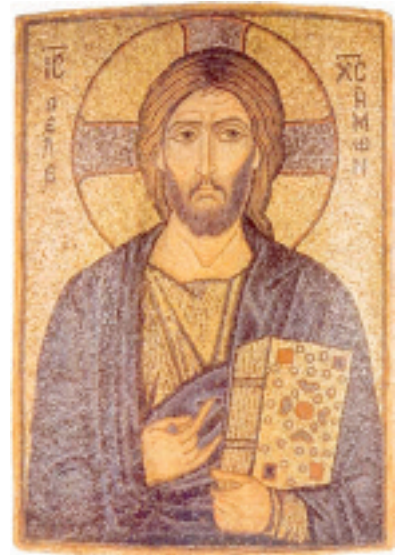
Taught by The Rev. Dane Wren

Discipleship

Most dictionaries do not contain the word "discipleship". For some people it may conjure up an ancient master training the next Kung-Fu Panda and calling him his disciple. Christians may think of the Bible and the disciples of Jesus. In both cases the word refers to "one trained or instructed to follow the one teaching." Jesus and the Kung-Fu master did just that, they trained those around them to do what they did. *Discipleship* produces *disciples* meaning that we "train and instruct" others on how to follow Christ. It is a lost art in our society, one which I would like to bring to your attention. Christ gave the call to each of us to teach others; to disciple them.

Often, Christians try to reinvent the wheel as to how to make an impact in our culture. Meanwhile, those having the most impact are following the model established over 2,000 years ago by Jesus himself. According to Matthew 13 and John 6 Jesus taught the multitudes. While this transformed some people, many in the multitude remained unchanged. His greatest impact was on the smaller groups that he invested in during his ministry, the 72. And still the ones most impacted were His 12 closest disciples. Consider the model laid out by Jesus:

Jesus did it – they observed
Jesus did it – they helped
They did it – Jesus encouraged and coached
They did it – Jesus left!

As I look around our culture today, it seems we don't need a new way of making a difference. We need to return to the old tried and true method that works. If we want to change the world for Christ it is time to follow the model that works and stop pretending there is an easier or better way. The question for you is, are you ready for the world around you to change? If so, let's get busy because we have a lot of work to do.
